About the project




We are proud to present Together Again 2, the follow-up to the successful Together Again project. Thanks to the support of the European Union's Erasmus+ programme, we will bring innovative and attractive methods to schools to help improve the psycho-social aspects of education.



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We are joining forces with seven partners from four countries - Slovakia, Poland, Spain and Turkey. Our partners include schools and NGOs with extensive experience in project management and school education, working together to improve the learning environment.

Main objectives



- To identify and address mental health issues such as increased stress, anxiety and depression.
- Support students in overcoming learning difficulties that make it difficult for them to succeed in school.
- Restore and improve social skills that may have been impaired due to social distancing and limited personal interactions.
- To support students in reassessing their goals and plans for the future that may have been affected by the pandemic.



Target groups

Primary target groups (end users)

- Primary and Secondary School Teachers: The main target group, as they need support in addressing the socio-emotional needs of students impacted by the pandemic.
- Students: The final beneficiaries of the project's efforts to improve their mental health and well-being.
- Parents: Involved in their children's education and well-being.
- Educational Establishments: Public and private schools, benefiting from improved teacher training and resources.

Collaboration and planning in focus

The beginning of 2025 is also the time of the first Together Again 2 meeting. It took place on 14th and 15th January in ancient Nitra, where the Fatranská Primary School, the coordinator of the project, is located.



The European Commission, through the National Agencies, has recognised the success of the first Together Again project. At the same time, the ERASMUS+ National Agency in Slovakia gave us the space for its continuation and development in the next two years. This support is a great motivation and encouragement for us to continue our work.

The second transnational meeting is scheduled for November 2025 in Turkey.
